A description of how non-attendance is managed by the school:

Rolls at My Independent School are marked manually 6 times throughout the day. The first marking is conducted no later 9:15am, then they are marked again at the beginning of each class.

Administration staff check rolls daily to ensure they have been marked accuracy. After the 9:00am roll office staff phone/text parents of unexplained absentees and record the reason for their absence. If it is necessary for a child to leave the school at a time other than normal dismissal time, prior notification must be made to the Principal or Business Manager. The child must be signed out at the office by the adult accompanying the child. Parents are required to fill out the necessary exemption forms for absences between 11-110 days and submitted for approval to the Principal.

Apparent Retention Rate Year 7 to 10:

The school's apparent retention rate must be published.

For 2023 the apparent retention rate is 0%. In 2019 the school only had 26 students across years 7-9. 2022 was only the second year of My Independent School having a year 10 cohort and parent elected to transition their young people to educational providers that had year 11 and 12 cohorts to enable a successful senior schooling transition.
